### Prerequisites

15 ECTS credits in dance practice, upper secondary level Dance 1, or one semester of documented dance courses in folk high school, or equivalent

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate technical skill in dancing,
2. carry out technical exercises in dancing dynamically and with musical ability,
3. give an account of what dance technique can be and how it can be defined, and
4. reason about dance technique in relation to their own bodies and skills.

### Content

The course covers the following:

- exercises in various types of dance techniques related to jazzdance, ballet, and

modern/contemporary dance

- discussion of the understanding and definition of the concept dance technique
- literature study

### **Examination**

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on an individual video assignment.

Learning outcomes 3 and 4 are assessed based on an individual written hand-in assignment.

### **Grades**

One of the grades Fail (U), Pass (G), or Distinction (VG) is awarded in the examination of the course.
