Prerequisites

DAGHD1 Housedance 1, 7.5 ECTS credits, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate an understanding of the aesthetics of housedance through improvisation,
2. perform housedance in explorative and creative ways based on the aesthetics of the genre,
3. create choreographies based on the foundations and traditions of housedance, and
4. give an account of housedance in terms of perspectives such as diversity and gender equality.

Content

The course covers the following:

- dance practice, housedance

- exploration of improvisation in dancing
- choreography work
- discussion of diversity and gender equality

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on dance performance in groups.

Learning outcome 3 is assessed based on a practical presentation in groups.

Learning outcome 4 is assessed based on an oral presentation in groups.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
