Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate an understanding of musical jazz by dancing with technical dance skills, dynamic qualities, and musical ability,
2. perform musical choreography with expressiveness and presence, and
3. explain the history of musicals with an emphasis on dance.

Content

The course covers the following:

- Jazz dance training related to musicals
- Exposure to various dance styles within musicals
- History of musicals

- Reflection on diversity and gender equality

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on dance performance in groups.

Learning outcome 3 is assessed based on an oral presentation in groups.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

The examiner may decide that a student who is very close to a passing grade can complete a supplementary assignment to receive a passing grade for a specific examination. If this is a possibility, the students must be informed in writing no later than the start of the course, and the examiner must specify when and how such a supplementary assignment may be permitted.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
