**Prerequisites**

**Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. demonstrate an understanding of musical jazz by dancing with advanced technical skills, dynamic qualities, and musicality,
2. dance in an exploratory and creative manner within the musical theatre genre,
3. choreograph combinations based on the foundations and traditions of musical theatre dance, and
4. give an account of musical jazz from perspectives such as diversity and gender equality.

**Content**

The course covers the following:

- Jazz dance training linked to musical theatre
- Exploration of various dance styles within musical theatre
- Choreographic work
- Discussions of democracy and diversity

**Examination**

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on dance performance in groups.

Learning outcomes 3 and 4 are assessed based on practical and oral group presentations.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

**Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
