Prerequisites

DAGSP1 Dance and stage performance 1, 7.5 ECTS credits, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- develop and perform choreographies with confidence and nuanced dynamics,
- create relevant choreographic material for a dance project including several participants, and
- discuss and problematise dance projects in terms of perspectives on sustainable development, gender equality, and intersectionality.

Content

Students practice choreographic methods and work with teaching their choreographic material to others. Their own creative processes are in focus alongside their dancing of choreographies, and the emphasis

is on performance rather than skills training. The course includes a stage performance project in which students are active as both choreographers and dancers. The course also covers current concepts that are relevant for the position of the field of dance in society today.

Examination

Assessment is based on stage performance and an individual written hand-in assignment.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
