### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2025-09-01, and is valid from the Spring semester 2026 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

90 ECTS credits in English or Comparative Literature as a main field of study, with at least 30 ECTS credits at the G2F level, and upper secondary level English 6 or English level 2, or equivalent

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. give an account of specialised knowledge of American literature from 1620 to 1919,
2. give an account of problems associated with literary historiography, especially in relation to genre issues,
3. critically analyse literature at a specialised level, and
4. critically evaluate different types of literary theory and criticism .

### Content

The course covers 300 years of American literature. American genres such as captivity and slave narratives are included, as well as essays, short stories, novels, and poetry. In addition to literary analysis, an important focus is literary historiography and related issues.

Instruction is in the form of seminars.

**Examination**

Assessment is based on individual written hand-in assignments and an individual oral presentation.

One of the grades Fail (U), Pass (G), or Distinction (VG) is awarded in the examination of the course.
