Course Approval

Prerequisites

90 ECTS credits in one of the main fields of study English, Comparative Literature, or Film Studies, including at least 30 ECTS credits at the G2F level, and upper secondary level English 6 or B, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. identify, describe, and analyse themes, problems, and genre-related issues relevant to dystopian and post-apocalyptic representations,
2. summarise, compare, and critically assess academic texts on dystopian and post-apocalyptic literature and apply them in analysis and interpretation of primary texts, and
3. express themselves well in English in terms of style and structure and present convincing analyses.

Content

The course includes study of dystopian and post-apocalyptic texts as cultural negotiations and in relation to social and historical contexts.

Students read dystopian and post-apocalyptic texts and academic articles on the subject, participate in oral seminar discussions and presentations, and produce written analyses.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1-3 are assessed based on individual written and oral assignments.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
