Prerequisites

English 1-90 ECTS credits, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. identify, describe and analyse genre conventions and thematic features in English language science fiction,
2. give an account of and reflect on how cultural encounters are represented and problematised in English language science fiction,
3. summarise and evaluate relevant secondary sources for science fiction studies, and
4. use English with stylistic awareness, effective structure and convincing analysis and argumentation in speech and writing.

Content

English language science fiction is introduced focusing on the genre's thematic representations and investigations of intercultural encounters in novels, short stories, feature films and TV series (primary sources). Encounters between humans and non-humans, between humans, creatures and machines and how such encounters with the unknown can serve as a basis for a discussion of cultural identity formation are explored. Secondary sources comprise literary history texts on the science-fiction genre and relevant critical articles on the primary sources.
