Course Approval

Prerequisites

90 ECTS credits in English, including at least 30 ECTS credits at the G2F level, and upper secondary level English 6 or B, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. identify, describe, and analyse the thematic and formal features of novels by African American women writers,
2. give an account of and evaluate theories of novels by African American women writers,
3. summarise and evaluate secondary material of relevance to novels by African American women writers, and
4. express themselves well in English in terms of style and structure and present convincing

analyses.

Content

The course treats novels by African American women writers from Frances E.W. Harper and Nella Larsen to science-fiction writer Octavia Butler and Nobel laureate Toni Morrison. The focus is on the 1980s, for various reasons an important decade for African American women writers and the theorisation of their works. This decade is characterised both by the rediscovery of early novels and by a great number of new novels by African American women writers who returned to previous themes and used them in new literary contexts.

Examination
