Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2023-05-15, and is valid from the Spring semester 2024 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

90 ECTS credits, including at least 30 ECTS credits at the G2F level and at least 7.5 ECTS credits at the second cycle level, in one of the main fields of study English, Swedish Language, or Linguistics, and upper secondary level English 6 or B, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

give an account of and describe research in literature and the literary research process,
apply literary methods, skills, and knowledge to research questions in English literary studies,

3. work both independently and in collaboration with active researchers on well-defined, current research questions in literary studies, and

4. plan and carry out advanced literary research tasks within a given time frame.

Content

This course provides students with hands-on research experience in a subfield of English literary studies. Students will become members of ongoing research projects that are being carried out at the department. They will contribute to the actual project work at hand, and obtain an in-depth understanding of the research process as a whole as well as gain relevant research skills and experience in English literary studies. Students will work in close collaboration with researchers based in the department, and at times with their national and international collaborators. Research-related tasks may include project planning, reviewing of research literature, and contributing to data collection, preparation, and analysis. The exact nature of tasks depends on the project contribution agreed on between the student and the project leader, and participation in the course is conditional on such a contribution agreement being approved at the outset of the course. Work contributed by the students will be acknowledged appropriately in publications or other dissemination of research results.

Examination

Assessment of all learning outcomes is both oral and written and based on completed research tasks, an individual written journal, and an individual written reflection assignment.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Pass (G) or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course. (RB 52/23 Dnr C2023/337)

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
