English for teaching in secondary education 1-90 ECTS cr, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

The aim of the course is that students enhance their analytical skills and subject-specific teaching knowledge in a theoretical perspective.

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of strategies for involving pupils in their language learning process
- bridge the gap between the classroom and the world
- translate language acquisition theories into practical activities
- develop strategies for the multicultural classroom
- deal with gender related issues in a language teaching perspective
- plan motivational activities for language use
- give an account of the historical background to the current view on language in school and society.

Content

The course deals with current language acquisition research and methods designed to involve and activate student interest in language and language learning in school and in life, gender aspects, core values and (inter)cultural issues.
