Prerequisites

General admission requirements and upper secondary level English 6 or English level 2, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. give an account of basic grammatical concepts, and
2. carry out basic sentence analysis.

Content

This is a preparatory course for undergraduate studies in language subjects, with an emphasis on English. Throughout the course, students learn basic grammatical concepts and how to identify grammatical components in clauses and sentences.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on an individual written hand-in assignment. Learning outcome 1 is also assessed based on a seminar.

Grades

One of the grades Pass (G) or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course (RB 127/25 Dnr C2025/681).
