### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2026-02-10, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2026 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

General entry requirements plus upper secondary level English 6 or English level 2.  
An equivalence assessment can be made.

### Learning Outcomes

Module 1 English Grammar, 7.5 cr.

Upon completion of the module, students should be able to

1. explain and use basic syntactic and morphological concepts,
2. describe, explain, and apply common grammatical structures and traits in spoken and written English, with a special focus on issues that might cause difficulties for learners and comparisons with Swedish, and
3. use Standard English in writing and identify and give an account of regional and stylistic variations in English.

Module 2 English Linguistics I: Concepts and Theories, 7.5 cr.

Upon completion of the module, students should be able to

1. describe basic linguistic concepts and apply them to language material,
2. give an account of the main features of central fields in English linguistics, and
3. analyse phenomena in English language usage from theoretical and applied perspectives, including comparisons with Swedish and other languages.

Module 3 English Language Proficiency, 7.5 cr.

Upon completion of the module, students should be able to

1. use nuanced and varied Standard English in speech and writing,
2. give an account of basic concepts and principles of English phonology, and apply those principles in practice in spoken English,
3. describe and explain common linguistic structures, traits, and variations in spoken English, with a special focus on issues that might cause difficulties for learners,
4. produce logically structured and stylistically effective texts in English, and
5. use sources and adhere to formal conventions for writing in English.

Module 4 Introduction to English Literature, 7.5 cr.

Upon completion of the module, students should be able to

1. define and use basic concepts in literary studies,
2. analyse different types of literature in English at a basic level, and

3. produce structured and coherent literary analyses in Standard English with correct source use.

### **Content**

The course comprises four modules.

Module 1 English Grammar, 7.5 cr.

The module provides a systematic survey of basic grammatical concepts and English syntax and morphology, including practical exercises and comparisons with Swedish. Stylistic and regional variations are discussed, but the main focus is Standard English.

Module 2 English Linguistics I: Concepts and Theories, 7.5 cr.

The module introduces basic concepts and theories in central English linguistic research fields. Students form an understanding of the structure and use of the English language and compare with Swedish and other languages. Linguistic problems are discussed and concepts and theories are applied in analysis exercises. Students are also introduced to linguistics as a research field, including its academic discourse.

Module 3 English Language Proficiency, 7.5 cr.

This module focuses on students' knowledge of and proficiency in spoken and written Standard English. Theoretical content is alternated with practical exercises which help students improve their pronunciation and written production in English. The course includes general writing skills but has a special emphasis on formal writing. Writing skills are developed through process writing in small groups.

Module 4 Introduction to English Literature, 7.5 cr.

The module focuses on the analysis of different types and genres of literature in English and introduces basic literary theory and concepts in literary studies. Students develop analytical and critical skills through oral and written assignments involving the application of relevant literary concepts.

### **Examination**

Module 1:

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an on-campus written exam.

Module 2:

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an on-campus written exam.

Module 3:

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an on-campus written exam.

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are also assessed based on active participation in seminars and an individual oral pronunciation test.

Module 4:

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an on-campus written exam.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

### **Grades**

One of the grades VG (Pass with Distinction), G (Pass), or U (Fail) is awarded in the examination of the course.

### **Quality Assurance**

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
