Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should have acquired the knowledge and skills to:

- 1. outline the historical development of crime fiction from the early 19th century until today,
- 2. identify the fundamental conventions of crime fiction, and
- 3. perform a basic critical analysis of crime fiction based on certain theoretical approaches.

Content

The course introduces crime fiction in English and its distinguishing features. The historically shifting function of crime fiction is demonstrated through representative works from the early 19th century until today.

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars.

Examination

Assessment of all learning outcomes is based on an individual written assignment presented and discussed in a final seminar.

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are also assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments and an individual oral presentation.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
