Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to

- 1. give an account of the main features of the historical development of literary science fiction,
- 2. give an account of the genre conventions of science fiction and theoretical perspectives on it, and
- 3. perform basic analyses of science fiction literature using literary theoretical perspectives.

Content

The course is an introduction to English-language science fiction literature. The course includes a historical overview of the development of the genre as well as the study of specific texts.

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars. The course involves mandatory written assignments. Towards the end of the course, students work on a final essay which is presented in a work-in-progress seminar before the final version is submitted.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1-3 are assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments and an individual written essay presented and discussed in a seminar.

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
