Course Approval

Prerequisites

General admission requirements plus upper secondary level English B or English level 2, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. compose basic text types in good English in the field of science and technology,
2. plan and carry out an oral presentation in English on a topic related to science and technology, and
3. adapt the language, complexity, and level of detail to different target audiences in both speech and writing.

Content

The purpose of the course content is to promote and develop students' communicative skills in English in the field of science and technology with a particular emphasis on user-

friendliness and global issues.

Meetings are focused on oral interaction and presentation exercises in pairs, small groups, or the entire class. In between meetings, students are responsible for working continuously with writing and specialised vocabulary, both individually and in groups, and for reflecting upon their own learning and given and optional topics. Students are aided by supervision, feedback from the teacher on hand-in assignments, and reading assignments on the course literature and other recommended texts and exercises available through the virtual learning environment.

English is used for all teaching, supervision, and course-related communication.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 3 are assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments. Learning outcomes 2 and 3 are assessed based on an individual oral presentation.

Grades

One of the grades Fail (U), Pass (G), or Distinction (VG) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
