Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Science 2016-03-09, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2016 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

Spanish 30 ECTS cr at undergraduate level with 22.5 cr completed on enrolment, including ESGA20, Written Proficiency 7.5 ECTS cr, or equivalent.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. analyse and interpret contemporary Spanish literature in different genres, using basic theoretical concepts,
2. independently analyse texts with a focus on their historical, cultural and literary context,
3. search for, assess and structure information and present it orally and in writing with correct handling of sources, quotations and references according to instructions, and
4. produce well structured and coherent texts in Spanish using correct terminology.

Content

The course includes reading, analysing and interpreting 20th and 21st century literary texts in different genres. Basic theoretical concepts are applied in the analysis and interpretation of the texts and contribute to developing students' understanding of literary perspectives and interpretation strategies.

Examination

Learning outcomes are assessed individually on the basis of written hand-in assignments. Learning outcomes 1-3 are also assessed on the basis of seminar discussions.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
