Course Approval

Prerequisites

Spanish 1-60 ECTS credits, including 30 ECTS credits at the G1F level or higher, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of central historical and cultural events in the Spanish-speaking world,
- give an account of and analyse current societal phenomena in relation to their historical and cultural context in the Spanish-speaking world, and
- retrieve and structure information and present it orally and in writing in Spanish with correct handling of sources, quotations, and references.

Content

The course describes and identifies the most central historical and cultural phenomena in the history of Spain from the 15th century until today. These phenomena are also studied on the basis of prose, newspaper articles, and a range of audio-visual material treating the history of Spain from historical, sociopolitical, and cultural perspectives. Students discuss Spanish culture and develop their skills in presenting, arguing, and defending their viewpoints orally in correct, varied, and idiomatic Spanish.

Assessment is based on a written exam and active participation in mandatory seminars.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
