Prerequisites

Spanish 1-60 ECTS credits, including 30 ECTS credits at the G1F level or higher, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- analyse Spanish-speaking literature from the perspectives of literary history and literary theory,
- apply literary theory concepts in the analysis and interpretation of Spanish-speaking texts in different genres from the 16th, 20th, and 21st centuries,
- produce structured and coherent texts in Spanish, and
- seek and structure information and present it orally and in writing with correct handling of sources, quotations, and references.

Content

Students read, analyse and interpret a representative selection of Spanish-speaking literary works from the 16th, 20th, and 21st centuries, and acquire in-depth knowledge of literary epochs and genres. The works are selected to illustrate and explain the development of literature in the Spanish-speaking world, and students develop their ability to reflect on the relation between different literary periods and analyse texts with the help of literary theories.

Assessment is based on a written exam and active participation in mandatory seminars.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
