Course Approval

Prerequisites

Spanish 1-60 ECTS credits, including 30 ECTS credits at the G1F level or higher, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of, analyse, and evaluate central theories and methods of foreign language acquisition related to teaching Spanish,
- give an account of and discuss non-verbal communication strategies in teaching Spanish as a foreign language, and
- apply theories and methods related to foreign language acquisition in planning the teaching of Spanish.

Content

The course has a focus on non-verbal communication as a compensatory strategy in teaching Spanish. The potentials of non-verbal communication, prosody, body language, facial expression, eye contact, and body contact in the classroom are treated, as are intercultural aspects related to the Swedish teaching contexts. The course also includes recording and analysis of the students' own non-verbal communication in the classroom.

Theory and practical exercises alternate to develop an understanding of how non-verbal communication can function also as a compensatory strategy in teaching Spanish.
