Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2017-02-13, and is valid from the Spring semester 2018 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

Business Administration 60 ECTS credits for courses in the Real Estate Management programme (SGFEK), including the course FEGB52 (business administration methods course).

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- independently identify and investigate a problem in the field of business administration,
- relate problems in the field of business administration to research methods
- search for, evaluate and use relevant theory for the chosen problem area,
- describe and analyse empirical data,
- present their research process and results orally and in writing, and
- critically review research studies.

Content

The degree project entails planning and completing relevant investigations, analysing the data and presenting conclusions. The written thesis should be related to real estate management and students are expected to participate in seminars and individual supervision sessions for support, and to defend their thesis at a final seminar. They are also required to review and discuss a fellow-student's thesis.

Supervision is only offered while the course is in progress. Reregistered students are offered additional supervision to the extent made possible by available resources.

Assessment is based on the submitted thesis and active seminar performance. The number of examination opportunities is limited to five due to limited resources.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
