- identify and problematise basic theories and research issues in public health science,

Competence and skills

- independently plan, conduct and present a research project in public health science,
- seek and demarcate literature relevant to the project,
- collect and analyse data,
- present a research project orally and in writing,

Judgement and approach

- critically approach other research projects and their own project results,
- demonstrate awareness of research ethical approaches in their project.

Content

Instruction is in the form of literature studies, group discussions, seminars, and supervision.

The course comprises:

- Proposal for a research project
- Academic thesis
- Research ethics
- Supervision
- Defence and peer reviewing

Examination

Assessment is based on a individual research project presented orally and in writing, and performance as a peer reviewer and seminar participant.

Supervision is provided until the assessment has been made, after which the student is nor longer entitled to further supervision. The number of assessment opportunities is limited to five.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
