#### **Course Approval**

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Health, Science and Technology 2024-09-04, and is valid from the Spring semester 2025 at Karlstad University.

#### **Prerequisites**

General admission requirements and 30 ECTS credits in a main area of study

#### **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. give an account of relevant actors and how they operate within public health work at the national, regional, and local levels,
2. identify parts of relevant laws and other policy documents that regulate public health work,
3. identify current issues and challenges in the field of public health,
4. provide examples of choices and strategies for development work in the field of public

health at the local and regional levels, and  
5. discuss how public funds can be allocated to promote public health.

### **Content**

This course aims to provide an increased understanding of the connection between political governance, societal actors, and public health work. The course outlines the structure and function of public administration in Sweden at the national, regional, and local levels. It addresses how public health policy is designed and implemented at various levels to achieve long-term and sustainable public health goals. Furthermore, the principles of democracy and citizen participation in decision-making processes that affect public health are discussed. The course also aims to problematise resource allocation issues from a public health perspective and justify related decisions.

### **Examination**

Assessment is based on individual written hand-in assignments and a group project discussed in a final seminar at the university.
