Examination

Assessment is based on a mandatory lecture, three seminars (two text seminars and one final seminar), and an individual take-home exam.

Learning objectives 1-4 are assessed on the basis of a written individual take-home exam presented and defended orally in a final seminar.

Learning objective 5 is assessed on the basis of a mandatory lecture, or, if a student cannot attend the lecture, a written individual hand-in assignment.

Learning objectives 6-7 are assessed on the basis of two text seminars.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement.
