Prerequisites

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. describe and apply relevant concepts, theories, and models to projects and evaluations related to public health work,
- 2. identify and give an account of factors that increase the potential of successful public health projects,
- 3. review and argue for a project and evaluation plan, and
- 4. give examples of ethical aspects of public health evaluation.

Content

The course covers project management and evaluation in relation to projects as a working method, with examples from various types of health promotion projects. The course also highlights the importance of evaluating public health work and its ethical aspects.

Examination
