Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of theories on the construction of gender in organisations and leadership,
 - problematise and discuss empirical phenomena from a gender-based perspective, and
 - evaluate and discuss aspects of gender in organisations and leadership.

Content

The course gives an introduction to how leadership, leadership theory, and the development and theories of organisational studies affect the construction of social gender in the contexts of work and professional

life. The course introduces feminist theories on and analyses of organisations and working life and provides insights into how research focused on gender, organisation, and working life can be conducted and evaluated. The course also covers basic practical aspects of gender equality work in organisations and workplaces and discusses the practice and politics of gender equality based on feminist perspectives.

Examination

Assessment is based on a written take-home exam and written hand-in assignments. The take-home exam is an individual assignment, discussed in a mandatory seminar. Hand-in assignments are completed both individually and in groups.

Grades

One of the grades Pass with Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
