Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. give an account of basic issues in gender studies and feminist epistemology with a focus on cultural constructions and doing gender, body, and sexuality in contemporary and historical contexts,
- 2. give examples of cultural constructions of gender, sex, body, and sexuality in different contemporary, historical, and socio-cultural contexts,

- 3. critically examine and discuss aspects of gender studies issues and the role of gender studies in cultural constructions of gender, sex, body, and sexuality in contemporary and historical contexts, and
- 4. independently produce well-structured texts in the field of gender studies, using sources correctly.

Content

The course introduces basic feminist epistemology and areas of knowledge in gender study with a focus on cultural constructions and doing gender, body, and sexuality in contemporary and historical contexts. It also provides an overview of theory of science from a feminist perspective. There is a focus on understanding feminist perspectives on materiality and biology and how sex is expressed and influences language and other forms of expression in everyday practices such as social media and popular culture.

Examination
