Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2019-11-28, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2020 at Karlstad University.

30 ECTS credits in Gender Studies, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- describe the role of men and masculinities for societal development,
- describe the development of masculinity studies and its role in gender studies,
- identify and define theories about men and masculinities used in gender studies,
- discuss research on men and masculinities in an international context, and
- communicate knowledge about men and masculinities coherently in terms of perspectives used in gender studies.

Content

The aim of the course is to provide an introduction to masculinity studies and research on men and masculinities in gender studies. The course also introduces how masculinity studies developed, including its role and position in gender studies and its relation to theories on men and masculinities as they developed as part of scholarship in gender studies. These aspects are contextualised through analyses of men and masculinities in various social, technological, and historical contexts. The role of men and masculinities for societal development is explored in an international perspective through comparisons between different cultural contexts. The course is aimed at those who want insights into ways of understanding and exploring men and masculinities beyond common everyday assumptions about what a man is, on the one hand, and, on the other, those who wish to extend their knowledge of gender studies through an in-depth study of the specialised field masculinity studies.

Examination

Assessment is based on two individually written hand-in assignments and one oral presentation in a seminar.
