Course Approval

Prerequisites

Bachelor degree of at least 180 ECTS credits with a major in History, History of Ideas, Cultural Studies, Religious Studies, Political Science, Social Science, Ethnology, Archeology, Sociology, Human Geography, or equivalent. Upper secondary level Swedish B/3 or Swedish as a Second Language B/3 and English A/6, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. describe the emergence and societal role of history research in a Swedish and international perspective,
2. identify and analyse what can be considered the most important events in world history and lines of

development in European historiography,

3. reflect upon how power structures have been challenged and consolidated historiographically, and how this has influenced inequality and gender equality in society.

Content

This course provides an introduction to advanced-level historical studies. Starting out from the perspective of historiography, the course offers an overview of developments in the Swedish and European writing of history over time. The course also examines how the writing of history has described, influenced, and been influenced by different kinds of power structures, for instance related to gender, class, and ethnicity.
