Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of basic concepts such as cognition, emotion, and sociality,
- give an account of relevant theories and methods in the field of sports psychology,
- give an account of socio-psychological processes that constitute, sustain, and dissolve groups, and of the importance of group processes in sports,

- relate individual cognitive, emotional, and social development to sports and health promotion activities, and

- apply behavioural theories to sports and health promotion activities.

Content

The course deals with basic concepts and theories of relevance to the knowledge of cognitive development, especially in the field of social psychology. The focus is on the individual athlete's cognitive, emotional, and social development and on the importance of group composition and team spirit to sports and health promotion. The course is based on theories on social interaction and group dynamics with respect to issues related to different forms of sports and health promotion activities.

Instruction is in the form of lectures, group work, and literature seminars.

Examination

Assessment is based on a written individual take-home exam, presented and discussed in a seminar.
