General admission requirements plus upper secondary level Mathematics E, Physics B, and Chemistry A, or Mathematics 4, Physics 2, and Chemistry 1

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of basic concepts in the areas of external accounting and management accounting,
- calculate and interpret key business indicators,
- analyse annual accounts and assess the financial situation of a company, and
- give an account of and apply basic business models in financial control.

Content

The course deals with external financing and financial control. The study of external financing centres on corporate annual reports, and skills in understanding and analysing the reports with the help of key indicators are developed. The study of financial control has a focus on instruments and models as well as the function of the models as a basis for decisions.

Examination

Assessment is based on a written exam and a written group hand-in assignment.
