### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2025-03-06, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2025 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

30 ECTS credits completed from semesters 1-4 in the Master programme in Industrial Engineering and Management (TACIE), or equivalent

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. describe strategies of operations management that contribute to sustainable corporate and societal development,
2. account for basic concepts in operations management,
3. identify and analyse problems associated to quality and capacity in the area of operations, and
4. apply quantitative calculation models and mathematical models to operations-related problems.

### Content

The course introduces and covers fundamental concepts in operations management. It treats models that can be used to identify and analyse problems and challenges in operations. Possible actions and decisions are discussed, considering both long-term and short-term consequences and opportunities, with an emphasis on operational decisions regarding production and distribution.

### Examination

Learning outcomes 1-3 are assessed based on a written exam.

Learning outcome 4 is assessed based on a written hand-in assignment completed in groups and presented and discussed in a seminar.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

### Grades

One of the grades Pass with Distinction (5), Pass not without Distinction (4), Pass (3), or Fail (U) is awarded in the

examination of the course.
