- 2. explain differences and similarities between internal efficiency (exploitation) and learning and continuous improvement (exploration),
- 3. give an account of the process and structure of coordinating several self-organising teams.
- 4. analyse a group based on the concept of psychological safety, and
- 5. give an account of and reflect upon self-organisation and how it affects decision-making,

Content

The course treats leadership from an agile perspective and comprises four areas of study:

- Organisational agility
- Leadership in agile environments
- Psychological safety and teamwork
- Decision-making and self-organisation
