Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of basic concepts and theories in the field of intercultural communication,
- identify cultural differences and similarities in international business processes,
- explain and reflect on the importance of culture in the areas of globalisation, leadership, verbal and non-verbal communication, the individual and groups, and negotiation,
- identify and give an account of cultural shock and its effects on interaction in different business contexts, and
- clarify the concept of intercultural competence and its importance in intercultural and international business contexts.

Content

The aim of the course is that students develop the knowledge and understanding required to work efficiently in an intercultural and international context with an emphasis on the world of commerce. Intercultural concepts and theories related to the world of business are analysed. The course covers areas such as globalisation, leadership, verbal and non-verbal communication, organisation, cultural shock, and intercultural competence.
