Course Approval

Prerequisites

60 ECTS credits in Intercultural Studies, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. systematically search for and evaluate intercultural research,
- 2. examine and critically discuss fundamental philosophy of science issues in relation to intercultural studies, and
- 3. critically discuss interdisciplinary aspects of intercultural research and theory development.

Content

The course involves a specialisation in a limited area of knowledge in the general field of intercultural studies, and students choose a focus in consultation with the teacher. The following areas of specialisation are offered to choose from: intercultural philosophy, intercultural epistemology, intercultural communication, or intercultural education. Students present the results of their specialisation projects orally in a seminar.

Examination

Learning outcome 1 is assessed based on an individual oral presentation in a seminar. Learning outcomes 2 and 3 are assessed based on an individual written hand-in assignment.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
