Prerequisites

60 ECTS credits in Intercultural Studies, and registered for IKGC01 Intercultural Studies III: Theory and Method (7.5 ECTS credits) and IKGC02 Intercultural Studies III: Intercultural Research (7.5 ECTS credits), or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. formulate a well-defined research question in the field of intercultural studies,
- 2. apply intercultural methods in an independent analytical project,
- 3. use theory-based sources in intercultural analyses,
- 4. defend and discuss their own projects, and

5. examine and review the projects of others.

Content

In this course, students complete independent projects and report the results in essay form. Essays are discussed in a mandatory seminar, where students defend their own projects and peer review the projects of other students.

Supervision is provided for the duration of the course. Reregistered students are offered supervision if circumstances permit.

Examination

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an independent project presented and discussed in a mandatory seminar, and peer review of the work of another student.

The number of examination opportunities is limited to five.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
