### Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2025-04-22, and is valid from the Spring semester 2026 at Karlstad University.

### Prerequisites

A Degree of Bachelor, Degree of Bachelor of Fine Arts, or vocational diploma of at least 180 ECTS credits, or equivalent

### Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. give an account of current research in the field of games, computer games, and game development,
2. compare and apply scientific research methods relevant to the field of games, computer games, and game development,
3. search for and critically evaluate scientific publications in the field of games, computer games, and game development, and
4. design a study within the field of game development.

**Content**

The course addresses current research, scientific theory, and various scholarly traditions relevant to the analysis and understanding of games in general, and computer games and game development in particular. It also covers planning and knowledge projection in preparation for a thesis project.

The primary forms of instruction are seminars and supervision. The course includes practical exercises in searching for and evaluating research publications, as well as techniques for data collection, analysis, and presentation. The course requires students to be responsible for working actively, individually and in groups.

**Examination**

Assessment is based on written hand-in assignments, completed individually and in groups and presented and discussed in seminars. Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

**Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

**Quality Assurance**

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
