Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- give an account of the components of a computer and their interaction,
- describe the role of software in relation to the hardware,
- give an account of different ways to develop software,
- explain how a computer network is structured,
- give an account of and apply the basic principles of computer security,
- discuss the human-computer interaction,
- describe the role of an information system in enterprise activities, and
- describe the structure and function of an enterprise system in an organisation.

Content

The course treats the basics of the physical and logical construction and function of information systems and their relation to humans and their enterprises. Aspects dealt with are the smallest computer components, equipment, computer types, memory, networks, communication and security, along with the analysis, design and construction of information and enterprise systems and their relation to fundamental administration and information needs. Also treated is the way the enterprise system constitutes a central unit in the company and can give management important information on which to base decisions and realize company strategies and goals.

Examination

Assessment is based on a written exam, and oral and written presentations of a group report. Two mandatory laboratory sessions are included on the use of an enterprise system and on information search.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U), is awarded in the examination of the course.
