Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course students should be able to use Unified Modeling Language (UML) to define static and dynamic systems aspects by applying object-oriented concepts for modelling and design.

Content and Form of Instruction

The course integrates system analysis, systems design and implementation design. The first part of the course deals with the semantics of a graphic language to express object-oriented concepts. Content is based on the class, status and interaction of the models. The second part focuses on the systems design process and develops the student's skills in object-oriented modelling. Instruction is in the form of lectures, seminars and laboratory work.

Examination

Assessment is based on hand-in assignments, mandatory seminars and a written exam. All laboratory work must also be completed before a course grade is awarded.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
