Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course students should be able to:

- identify object-oriented properties in a written performance specification and translate into a programming language,
- identify imperative properties in a textual performance specification and translate into a programming language,
- describe the relation between specification, design, implementation and documentation,
- give an account of the main features of a program development process,
- give an account of how a project organisation should be built to support the program development process, and
- set up tests to ensure the quality of the software.

Content

The aim of the course is that students develop a general understanding of the flow from idea to delivered system. It deals with both imperative and object-oriented analysis and design and addresses basic aspects of test and project management. An overview of the system development process is provided and object-oriented design is translated into an object-oriented programming language. Imperative development is dealt with in laboratory work. Instruction is in the form of lectures, laboratory supervision and seminars.
