Course Approval

Registered for ISGB02 Web Development (7.5 ECTS credits) or ISGA11 HTML and CSS for Web Development (5 ECTS credits) or MKGA63 Web Design I (15 ECTS credits), or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. explain concepts and central issues in the area of digital accessibility,
2. identify and describe digital accessibility tools,
3. evaluate web pages and mobile applications based on internet accessibility standards,
4. describe aspects of accessibility for digital documents and apply these to design and review documents, and

5. communicate knowledge of laws, ordinances, technical and research literature in the area of digital accessibility, both orally and in writing.

Content

Introductory lectures provide an overview of the concept "accessibility" and related concepts, as well as laws, ordinances, standards, and research literature. Later lectures are often followed by workshops in which students work with aspects of the course content, for instance assessment of accessibility in accordance with standards for apps and documents (HTML, pdf, and other common formats), either individually or in small groups. Some lectures cover areas that are not practiced in the course, such as writing for the web in accessible ways and selecting participants for user tests related to accessibility assessment.

Examination

Assessment is based on an individual written report presented and discussed in a mandatory seminar, and a written peer review report.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
