Course Approval

Prerequisites

60 ECTS credits in Information Systems, including Introduction to programming, 7.5 ECTS credits, and either Object-oriented modelling with programming, 7.5 ECTS credits, or Introduction to object-oriented programming, 5 ECTS credits, or equivalent

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. explain and apply concepts used in relation to software architectures,
2. describe methods for the design and evaluation of software architecture,
3. carry out basic design and evaluation of a software architecture,
4. explain and apply advanced modelling principles for architectural design, and
5. reflect upon and analyse the relationship between software architecture and quality.

Content

The aim of the course is for students to acquire a basic understanding of software development and its role in the development of software systems. Interactive and practical activities such as workshops provide students with the opportunity to develop their skills in relation to the course components and intended learning outcomes.

Examination

All learning outcomes are assessed based on an individual written and oral presentation. Learning outcome 3 is also assessed based on written hand-in assignments completed in groups.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation.
