Learning Outcomes

Knowledge and understanding

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- demonstrate good knowledge of the Swedish form of government and constitution,
- demonstrate good knowledge of the Swedish legislation and precedence of rules,
- demonstrate good knowledge of the importance of constitutional principles to the applications of law,
- demonstrate good knowledge of the freedom of speech and freedom of the press act as well as of access rights and secrecy, and
- demonstrate good knowledge of Swedish administrative and local government law.

Competence and skills

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- identify, analyse and suggest solutions to constitutional problems in law practice,
- understand public agencies' management of an administrative case,
- decide when a document is public or not in an administrative case, and
- analyse the relation between municipal autonomy and the national level standard-setting power.

Judgement and approach

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- adopt a constitutional perspective on legal practice,
- demonstrate insight into the importance of human rights in the application of law,
- demonstrate understanding of the possible conflicts involved between freedom of speech and the

press and other principles worth protecting such as personal integrity, and
- demonstrate understanding of the different duties and roles of public agencies and municipalities.

Content

The course deals with basic Swedish government and constitutional law. The foundations of the Swedish constitution and public administration are treated. Also the constitutional freedom of the press act and rules for public access and secrecy in public agencies are treated, as are municipal autonomy and the local government law.

Grades

One of the grades Pass with Distinction (AB), Pass with Some Distinction (BA), Pass (B), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
