Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course students should be able to:

- demonstrate understanding of the role of the image in the communication process and the importance of visualisation and images for technological development,
- use techniques of drawing in explorative image work as well as visualisation and problem-solving methods,
- use analogue and digital drawing techniques,
- reflect on, discuss and critically evaluate their own drawings and those of others as process as well as product, and
- assess and reflect on research-based knowledge in relation to visualization.

Content

The course includes theoretical and practical elements aimed to provide the opportunity for students to develop skills in drawing and awareness of visualisation and its importance to the technical development.

The components of the course are:

- using drawing to visualise ideas analogically and digitally
- survey of the content and form of image work and of the correspondence between analogue and digital drawing, and
- studies of body and space, model studies and groquis.

Examination

Assessment of learning outcomes is based on the portfolio method whereby students collect their images and texts in digital form, on individual hand-in assignments which are presented and discussed in mandatory seminars, and on students' discussions of the drawings of others.

Grades

One of the grades Fail (U) or Pass (G) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement.
