Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

- 1. give examples of the form, style and performance praxis of the chosen repertoire,
- 2. describe the history and development of their instrument, and
- 3. describe simple techniques and methods for rehearsing and performing.

Competence and skills

- 4. demonstrate basic technical instrument skills,
- 5. use simple techniques and methods when rehearsing and performing the chosen

repertoire,

- 6. discern technical problems and rendition difficulties in the repertoire in question,
- 7. play simple and intermediate level musical pieces prima vista,
- 8. rehearse and perform a repertoire with regard to its style and performance praxis, and
- 9. perform the repertoire for other musicians.

Judgement and approach

- 10. reflect on their approach to music-making, and
- 11. reflect on their own learning process.

Content

Students rehearse, interpret, and perform a chosen repertoire in Western classical music on their main instrument. The course includes the description, study, and practical application of repertoire, style, and interpretation as well as descriptions of methods for rehearsing and performing. The history and development of the main instrument in the Western classical music tradition is treated. Students also study and practice basic technical exercises and methods for rehearsing and performing a chosen repertoire and train sight-reading of simple to intermediate level music notations. Students play repertoire for basic instrumental skills. Parts of the repertoire are performed in in-house concerts. Students also reflect upon music learning and approaches to music. Instruction is in the form of individual tutorials, seminars, and master classes.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1-3 are assessed based on individual oral presentations.

Learning outcomes 10-11 are assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
