# **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. give an account of the form, style, and performance praxis of the basic repertoire of music from different epochs,
- 2. give an account of different techniques and methods for rehearsing and performing,
- 3. demonstrate enhanced technical skills on their main instrument,
- 4. discern and test different technique and rendition solutions in the chosen repertoire,
- 5. play or sing intermediate and advanced level music notation a vista,
- 6. rehearse and perform a repertoire according to basic knowledge of its style and

performance praxis,

- 7. give an account of their music performance to other musicians,
- 8. reflect upon their own and others' approach to musical performance, and
- 9. reflect upon and describe their own learning process.

#### Content

Students study, interpret and perform a chosen repertoire in Western classical music on their main instrument. The course includes reports, reflections, and applications of repertoire, style, and interpretation as well as descriptions of techniques and methods for rehearsing and performing. The course also offers instruction and application of technically advanced exercises and of techniques and methods for rehearsing and performing a chosen repertoire as well as sight-reading of music notation at various levels of complexity. Repertoire that requires advanced technical skills on the main instrument is included as well. Parts of the repertoire are performed in in-house concerts. Students reflect upon musical learning processes and approaches to music.

Instruction is in the form of individual tutorials, seminars, and master classes.

#### **Examination**

Learning outcomes 1-2 and 7 are assessed based on individual oral presentations. Learning outcomes 3-6 are assessed based on individual musical performance. Learning outcomes 8-9 are assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments.

#### **Grades**

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
