Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

Knowledge and understanding

1. discuss form, style and performance praxis of the chosen repertoire.

Competence and skills

2. within a given time frame, rehearse, interpret, and perform repertoires from different epochs in various forms of ensembles,

- 3. discern and test different rendition solutions in the repertoire concerned based on fundamental knowledge of style and performance praxis,
- 4. interact musically with other musicians and ensemble leaders, and
- 5. perform and communicate the repertoire to an audience.

Judgement and approach

- 6. reflect upon their own and others' approach to musical interaction, and
- 7. reflect upon their own performance skills and development potential as members of an ensemble.

Content

Students study and perform Western classical music repertoires from different epochs in various ensemble constellations. There are presentations and discussions of style, performance praxis, notation issues, and interpretation from different epochs and ensemble constellations, and students reflect on approaches to musical interaction as well as their own performance and development potential. Piano students also practise accompaniment. Parts of the repertoire are performed in in-house concerts. Instruction is in the form of group lessons and concentrated rehearsals during project weeks.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 6-7 are assessed based on individual oral presentations discussed in ensemble classes, seminars, and group fora.

Learning outcomes 2-5 are assessed based on musical performance in groups.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G) and Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
