Course Approval

The syllabus was approved by the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences 2024-03-01, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2024 at Karlstad University.

Prerequisites

Admitted to the Bachelor Programme in Music (HGMSK), 180 ECTS credits

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. analyse and notate basic harmonies in Western music, specifically Viennese Classical Period, and apply basic principles of voice leading in accordance with the Western functional harmonic tradition,

2. carry out basic instrumentation for various string instruments,

3. identify, analyse, and perform rhythm, melody, and harmony in Western tonal music at a basic level,

4. apply the basics of notational software and recording software (DAW), and

5. reflect upon their own and other persons attitudes towards musical conventions and norms.

Content

Harmonics and harmonic progression in Western music, specifically Viennese Classical Period, are discussed. Presentations of and practical exercises in ear training in Western tonal music are included, as well as instrument knowledge and instrumentation for various string instruments. Potential applications of notation and sequencer software in different musical and artistic contexts are introduced and practiced.

Instruction is in the form of group tutorials and seminars.

Examination

Learning outcomes 1 and 2 are assessed based on individual written hand-in assignments. Learning outcome 3 is assessed based on an individual written exam and individual musical performance.

Learning outcome 4 is assessed based on individual written and creative hand-in assignments.

Learning outcome 5 is assessed based on oral presentations in group tutorials.

Submissions for assessment must clearly indicate individual contributions.

If students have a decision from Karlstad University entitling them to Targeted Study Support due to a documented disability, the examiner has the right to give such students an adapted examination or to examine them in a different manner.

Grades

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.

Quality Assurance

Follow-up relating to learning conditions and goal-fulfilment takes place both during and upon completion of the course in order to ensure continuous improvement. Course evaluation is partly based on student views and experiences obtained in accordance with current regulations and partly on other data and documentation. Students will be informed of the result of the evaluation and of any measures to be taken.
