Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. produce electronic music from an idea to a finished product and describe the tools that have been used.
- 2. give examples of some electronic music genres and differences between them,
- 3. perform electronic music in a simple form in front of an audience,
- 4. present a general lesson and course plan for teaching electronic music to young learners.

Content

The course covers skills and techniques of producing electronic music, including midi and sound

management, audio engineering effects, sampling, synthesizer programming and mixing, and different performance practices.

The course includes listening to and analyzing different genres of electronic music, different types of sound, experiences, and musical patterns. Examples are also discussed and compared in terms of a general historical context.

The course also includes the methodology of teaching electronic music production.

Examination

One of the grades Distinction (VG), Pass (G), or Fail (U) is awarded in the examination of the course.
