### **Course Approval**

The syllabus was approved by the Board of Teacher Education 2019-02-11, and is valid from the Autumn semester 2019 at Karlstad University.

#### Prerequisites

LPGKF8 completed and enrolled in LPGK10 and LPGK11, or equivalent

#### Learning Outcomes

The aim of the course is that students develop knowledge and understanding of ways in which teachers enable pupils' learning and knowledge development and promote a democratic, safe, and inspiring learning environment, taking into account different perspectives on teaching and learning.

Upon completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. give an account of and problematise current theories of pedagogical leadership,
- 2. problematise how teachers' leadership can be exercised in a diversity context,
- 3. give an account of and problematise theories relevant for communication, group processes, and

common values in a school context,

4. problematise how norms and values can affect work procedures and teaching content,

5. problematise the importance of teacher leadership for pupils' engagement in their own learning processes, and

6. demonstrate communicative ability in listening, speaking, and writing and in using a language appropriate to the situation.

#### Content

The course comprises the following components:

-pedagogical leadership, i.e. leading children's and young people's knowledge development -teacher leadership in relation to teaching as well as school governance and management

-teachers' approaches to pupils' differences

-teachers' communicative skills, including communication in digital environments and exercises in conversation techniques and forms of cooperation

-theories of group dynamics and theoretical perspectives on strategies for preventing conflicts and strategies for avoiding discriminatory and offensive behaviour in different environments, including problem-solving skills

-teachers' leadership in relation to the teacher's role as the norm setter, and issues of power and democratic principles in relation to pupil influence and participation

-professional ethics and restrictions

-cooperation with guardians, authorities, and society at large

-factors affecting learners' motivation

-analysis of pedagogical and subject-specific methodological considerations.

The course includes various forms of work and students play an active role, for instance in case studies, group conversations, and seminars.
